October 12–13**Cashmere, Washington**

Eleven early arrivals on Wednesday and Thursday, October 12 and 13, had the rally warmed up and going by the time all 25 were parked on Friday at the Chelan County Fair Grounds in Cashmere, Wash. As hard as we tried to replicate the original organizational rally, the weather wouldn't cooperate and provide the snow. Oh, well! Can't fault us for not trying.

There was lots of reminiscing with the help of the Historians photo albums and digital slide show of the last five years provided by President Frank Ward. A group was organized by Tom and Kathy for a guided tour of the Rocky Reach Dam on Friday. Never to fail, the pot luck was finger lick'n good. Saturday started with a continental breakfast and then onto the Farmers Market and the Saint Laurent Winery for many, and Leavenworth for others. Before dinner, judges picked the winners of the "Cutest Apple" (Guy & Suzi Thompson and Gary & Linda Pennington) and "Most Creative Pumpkin" (George & Betty Green and Frank & Della Ward). This once again proved just how resourceful and creative CBC'rs really are. Dinner was catered by CBC Member Gary Phippen and new CBC Member Bruce Lann from Leavenworth.

After our Saturday night dinner, Kathy Storrs shared recollections about the club formation rally held at the Chelan County Fair Grounds on October 17, 1996. She reported: "At the formation rally, 63 coaches registered, five cancelled and five more didn't show up, probably because it snowed. Of the 53 in attendance, 40 became charter members at the rally. Of those 40, 10 registered for this rally and eight arrived. Wayne Burchett, our first President, and Chuck Schnell, our first Second VP, regrettably had to cancel for health reasons. The other original officers were First Vice President, Herschel Heimbigner (present), Bonnie Gottschalk, Secretary (present), Kathy Marston (Storrs), Treasurer (present), Jody Davis, National Director and Paul Eisen, Alt. National Director. Officers were elected in the same room



we are in now. Charter membership was left open until January of 1997, resulting in 71 charter members. Thirteen of them are here and 26 are still in the chapter." The charter members were asked to stand and be recognized. Photos were taken and the celebration continued. Sunday morning started with a catered breakfast, more reminiscing, group photographs, and long, lingering "see ya's" well into the afternoon.
